Swifts-in-South-Brent initiative: You're invited to apply for a Swift nest-box for your home which could be yours free of charge (although donations are more than welcome). Similar endeavours elsewhere have shown that installing multiple Swift nest-boxes results in a pleasing increase in the numbers of successful fledglings. Swifts are pretty picky when it comes to where they will nest, so nest-boxes need to be placed:

- on the wall of a building, ideally under the eaves (where the roof hangs over);
- Facing North, or East, or somewhere in between;
- 5 meters (15 feet) above the ground; with a clear flight path to allow for the Swift's high-speed swooping approach (see also the RSPB's Swift Mapper).

If you would like to see a Swift nest box on your house or outbuilding or think you have the perfect spot, or know of any current, abandoned or potential Swift nesting sites and would like to apply for a Swift nest-box, please contact the Swifts in South Brent team, email yaa@ssb.org.uk, sending your contact details and information about your location, or enquire in The Hub at the Old School Community Centre. between 9:30am and 11am on a Monday, Wednesday or Friday. As we aim for the best chance of success, the nest boxes will be allocated to sites which best fit the criteria. Help with installation is available and the work needs to be completed during April. - £2.00 bus fare cap: The bus fare cap on a single bus ticket on most services in England outside London, introduced from 1st January 2023 was due to be raised to £2.50 from 31 October 2023 until November 2024. Stagecoach have announced (19/12/2023) that it is extending its offer of a maximum fare of just £2 for a single bus journey until the end of June 2024. Passengers will continue to be charged no more than £2.00 for a single journey as part of the Department for Transport's National Bus Fare Cap scheme and will apply on most single bus journeys across England (including child and student fares). In addition to the fortnightly 'Grey Bin' collection of non-recyclable refuse (and fortnightly Brown Bin green waste collection if you have paid a subscription for it), there is now a weekly collection of paper, card, plastics, metal tins and glass for recycling in 2 green recycling boxes and a reusable heavy duty white recycling sac, and a weekly food waste collection in a large, kerbside, food waste caddy. - OLD SCHOOL RAISE THE ROOF: The roof of the Old School Community Centre remains in urgent need of repair. Despite the major campaign which has been running since 2017, with £150,000 needed do the whole roof, the Roof Fund currently stands at £34,059. It could be tackled section by section based on the funds raised, but it would be better to get whole job done at one time. The roof is critical to the existence of the Centre and therefore to all the individuals, groups and organisations who use it. The <u>South Brent Community Fridge</u> is installed near the centre of the village to the side of the entrance to the <u>Old School Community Centre</u> (blue Louvre boiler room door) and is being well used. *It is open 24hours a day*. Surplus and end of line food is collected by volunteers from supermarkets and local businesses, who would otherwise be disposing of it, and put in the community fridge for anyone to take what they wish. If you have spare food yourself, if you are going on holiday or have extra vegetables in your allotment, you can also put it in the fridge to share. Guidelines on what food is safe to share are posted by the fridge, and the fridge will be checked daily by a dedicated team of volunteers. It's a win-win situation for the environment and the people of South Brent. Please use it!!! If you would like to volunteer to help the community fridge, please contact <u>fridge@ssb.org.uk</u>.
